Accounting Business Analytics Sequence

This sequence is designed to provide entry-level accountants with information systems and technology skills as required for our separate accounting department accreditation by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). This sequence will also prepare accountants to be a critical business users of information technology in an business analytics context and an evaluator of Information systems.

Students selecting the Accounting Business Analytics Sequence must complete the following:

-74 required hours: BUS 100; ACC 131, 132, 230, 231, 232, 233, 235, 261, 263, 270, 271, 353, 366 or 371; ECO 105; ENG 145A13; FIL 185, 240; MAT 121 or 145; MKT 230; MQM 100, 220, 227, 385.

Provide a description for the proposed program.

The Accounting - Business Analytics Sequence provides students with accounting foundation coursework integrated with recent and emerging business analytics technology, tools and methods in critical business decision making. This sequence uniquely leverages the combined strenghts of the Department with Accounting and Business Information Systems (BIS) programs offered in the same department.

4. Provide a rationale of proposed program.

This is a new Business Analytics sequence in ISU's Accounting Program. This sequence was developed to satisfy our separate accounting department accreditation requirements (AACSB, standard 7). The Business Analytics sequences offers the newer BIS courses to Accounting majors including Introduction to Business Analytics (ACC271), Forensic Analytics (ACC353), Data Base Management (ACC366), and Intermediate Business Analytics (ACC371).

Describe the expected effects of the proposed program on existing campus programs (if applicable).

Currently, there are four sequences for Accounting students (AIS, BIS, Career Speciality and Financial Accounting). This provides Accounting Students with a new sequence to select from entitled "Business Analytics Sequence". As the Accounting program continues to grow, this new sequence provides students with a fantastic new program that uniquely combines the resources in the Department with Accounting and Business Information Systems (BIS) faculty and resources.

This sequence is designed to provide entry-level accountants with information systems and technology skills and competencies as recommended by the International Federation of Accountants (IFAC). This sequence will also prepare accountants to be a critical business users of information technology in an business analytics context and an evaluator of Information systems. Students selecting the Accounting Business Analytics Sequence must complete the following 74 required hours: BUS 100; ACC 131, 132, 230, 231, 232, 233, 235, 261, 263, 270, 271, 353, 366 or 371; ECO 105; ENG 145A13; FIL 185, 240; MAT 121 or 145; MKT 230; MQM 100, 220, 227, 385.

7. Describe the expected curricular changes required, including new courses. If proposals for new courses have also been submitted, please reference those related proposals here:

The Accounting Program's new Business Analytics Sequence includes ACC271 (Intro to Business Analytics), ACC353 (Forensic Analytics), ACC366 (Database Management), and ACC 371 (Intermediate Business Analytics). Compared to the other IS sequences, the BA sequence includes less technical programming and less systems analysis and design. The newest courses in this sequence are ACC353 (Forensic Analytics) which was first offered in Summer 2017 and ACC 371 IIntermediate Business Analytics) to be offered in the Fall of 2018.

Anticipated funding needs and source of funds.

No additional funding is needed. The Accounting Department has added BIS Faculty in the department in recent years due to faculty retirements and to meet increase demand in BIS / IS courses in the Department and the College of Business levels.
