The Legal Studies: Language Integration Sequence is a major focused on paralegal education with an emphasis on developing an awareness and sensibility to the language, culture, and issues of legal clients from targeted ethnic groups within the community.

Notes

- A. Students who have strong oral skills in Spanish can receive credit for SPA 214 by taking the Oral Proficiency Exam (OPE) with a professor from the Languages, Literature, and Cultures (LAN) Department. Students may take the OPE if they meet the qualifications set by the LAN Department.
- B. Students who have no prior foreign language experience must complete SPA 111 (4 hours), SPA 112 (4 hours), SPA 115 (4 hours), and SPA 116 (4 hours). These students would need to complete 65 credit hours in the major to earn the degree.
- C. Heritage Spanish speakers may be placed by the LAN Department in SPA 119 or SPA 120.
- D. Prerequisites for both SPA 213 and SPA 214 are SPA 116 or SPA 120. Prerequisites for SPA 244 is SPA 213 or 214.
- E. It is recommended that Legal Studies majors enroll in POL 106 in their first year of study. Transfer students wishing to complete the major are recommended to enroll in POL 106 in their first year at Illinois State University if they have not already had an equivalent course.
- F. LGS 398A20 may be substituted for one of the Legal Studies elective courses with consent of either the Department Chair or the Director of Legal Studies.

3. Provide a description for the proposed program.

This sequence provides paralegal training while developing intermediate Spanish language skills to communicate sufficiently with Spanish-speaking clients to facilitate attorney representation of these clients.

4. Provide a rationale of proposed program.

There is a growing demand for paralegals with proficiency in a second language both nationally and in Illinois. This program will prepare students for this career path. Our research reveals that only one of the 231 American Bar Association-approved paralegal education programs in the nation offers a similar program. There is no language integrated program option offered by any of the 13 other ABA-approved paralegal education programs in Illinois.
