6. Rationale for Proposal:

The Commercial Recreation and Program Management sequences in the Recreation and Park Administration (RPA) curriculum had not been reviewed for over ten years. During this time, the distinctions between Commercial Recreation (e.g., resorts, convention and visitors bureaus, the fitness industry, tourism industries, etc.) and Program Management sequences (e.g., park districts, youth serving agencies, non-profit agencies, etc.) have blurred. Topics of study (marketing, finance, risk management, alternate sources of funding) which were previously unique to one sequence or the other are now common to both sequences. Therefore, the proposed the new sequence is Recreation Management (under separate program cover) and request the deletion of Commercial Recreation (and Program Management under separate program cover).

7. Arrangements to be made for program faculty and students

Since the proposed Recreation Management sequence will replace Commercial Recreation, it is anticipated that new students will be advised to select from either the Recreation Management or Therapeutic Recreation sequences. The number of courses in the proposed Recreation Management sequence is unchanged so faculty will be unaffected.

9. Anticipated impact on other campus programs

Since the proposed Recreation Management sequence will replace Commercial Recreation, it is anticipated that there will be no adverse impact on other campus programs.

10. Anticipated budgetary effect

Since the proposed Recreation Management Sequence will replace the Commercial Recreation sequence, it is anticipated that there will be no budgetary change in this new sequence as current faculty will be teaching the new and revised courses.

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Commercial Recreation Sequence:

-67 total hours required

-39 hours in core courses: KNR 170, 170.01, 171, 198.30, 270, 271, 298.30, 375, 376, 378.30, 398.30

-12 hours in sequence courses: KNR 275, 277, 374, 377

-16 hours in interdisciplinary courses: ACC 131; MKT 230; FIL 208; 6 hours selected from ACC 132; FIL 209, 240; MQM 140, 220, 226; MKT 233; 1 hour selected from approved Art, Music, Theatre, or Physical Education courses.

-Recommended courses: COM 123, 223; ECO 105; ACS 150 or 155.01

-Non-business majors who desire to elect more than 30 hours of their course work in business must meet all College of Business requirements for graduation. These students should register for additional courses only in person and with the written permission of the College of Business Advisor.

- 11 hours in interdisciplinary courses selected with advisement from the following cognate groups: event management, outdoor and environmental education, youth, recreation sports, park planning, enterprise management, and public/non-profit management

Certification Opportunity:

Students graduating from this program are immediately eligible to sit for the examination to become a Certified Park and Recreation Professional.

Therapeutic Recreation Sequence:

- 67 total hours required.
- 39 hours in core courses: KNR 170, 171, 270, 271, 298.30, 298.36, 370, 376, 378.30, 380, 398.30
- 12 hours in sequence courses: KNR 273, 278, 279, 373.
- 16 hours in interdisciplinary courses: HSC 105; KNR 181 or 182; PSY 113, 350; 4 hours selected from approved **applied** Art, Music, Theatre, (3 hours) and Physical Education (1 hour).

Certification Opportunity:

Students graduating from the Therapeutic Recreation Sequence who have met all the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (NCTRC) requirements (major and recommended courses including an approved internship) are eligible to apply to sit for the examination to become a Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist.
