This minor sequence in teacher education is not aligned to the ISBE endorsement standards and therefore creates confusion among students who wish to become licensed to teach physical education. The Athletic Coaching Sequence in the Minor in Physical Education will be retained.

This change still leaves open the possibility of earning an endorsement in physical education. It is anticipated that this change will have no negative impact on any current or future students wishing to pursue the physical education endorsement.
