The sequence follows a 6-semester plan of study. Starting the minor at a Junior or Senior standing could require additional semesters at Illinois State University to complete the minor.

3. Provide a description for the proposed program.

A Minor in Stage Combat is designed for those who wish to supplement their degree in pursuit of working in Theatre, Film, Television and/or Motion Capture by training in this specific physical art.

The 24-hour minor follows the established foundational courses within the Acting Sequence. Those courses are THE 110 (Acting I), THE 210 (Acting II), THE 256 (Voice and Movement I). The remaining courses provide the student with the requisite skills to begin a career in this specialized field. Those courses are THE 224 (Stage Combat), THE 324.01 (Advanced Stage Combat: Unarmed and Single Sword), THE 324.02 (Advanced Stage Combat: Knife and Rapier & Dagger), THE 324.03 (Advanced Stage Combat: Broadsword and Smallsword), and THE 324.04 (Advanced Stage Combat: Quarterstaff and Sword & Shield).

4. Provide a rationale of proposed program.

The Society of American Fight Directors has been focused on safety in staged violence since 1977. While they have worked tirelessly throughout the decades training performers about safe staged violence practices, the theatrical community has been slow to understand its validity. Unfortunately, it is only when a performer gets injured that companies take notice that safety precautions need to be held to a higher standard.

As of late, more and more people in the performing arts are calling to attention the importance of safety in the workplace. New organizations like Intimacy Directors & Coordinators (IDC) and Not In Our House (NIOH) are showing the world that safety for our performers is a top priority. Illinois State University School of Theatre and Dance has the ability to be at the forefront of this movement toward ensuring that safety is essential.

The Illinois State University School of Theatre and Dance Stage Combat Minor is geared toward providing students with the most extensive training program in the country. The introductory combat course of the minor involves over 60 hours of hands-on training in Unarmed, Knife, and Single Sword (basic sword fighting style originating from Hollywood swashbuckling era). This foundation leads to over 30 hours in each of the eight disciplines (spread out over four courses) offered for certification by the Society of American Fight Directors (SAFD). If the student chooses to take the optional Skills Proficiency Test (SPT), they will have the ability to graduate with all SPT Certifications, thus giving our students the opportunity to graduate holding the rank of "Advanced Actor/Combatant" through the SAFD.

This new Minor will propel Illinois State University's School of Theatre and Dance to the forefront of Stage Combat training in the country.

The five proposed new courses required for the minor are THE 224 Stage Combat, THE 324.01 - Advanced Stage Combat: Unarmed and Single Sword, THE 324.02 - Advanced Stage Combat: Knife and Rapier & Dagger, THE 324.03 - Advanced Stage Combat: Broadsword and Smallsword, and THE 324.04 - Advanced Stage Combat: Quarterstaff and Sword & Shield.
