3. Provide a description for the proposed program.

The Audio and Music Production sequence provides concentrated study in sound recording, audio production, sound design, music composition, theory, and business and entrepreneurship practices, along with a host of elective experiences across a range of creative/technical fields including video, sound, electronic music, music production, gaming, motion graphics, interactivity, AR/VR, UI/UX, mobile, web, and computer programming concepts

4. Provide a rationale of proposed program.

Many Creative Technologies students are sound-focused and demand more courses in the field of music and audio production. In addition, the School of Music is encountering many prospective students who could not (yet, perhaps, due to background challenges) successfully complete the SOM's current classical instrument audition requirements but still wish to pursue a career in music or audio production. This sequence will service these students, opening up career choices for audio and music production, but also, expose them to a wider breadth of knowledge than a traditional sound-focused audio arts degree.

There is a demand for these types of courses within other areas of the CFA, not only in the SOM, but also Theatre and Dance. Technical sound production courses could also service Engineering students.

5. Describe the expected effects of the proposed program on existing campus programs (if applicable).

Most of the courses in this sequence have already been taught and are open to other schools within WKCF, with students from other areas of SOM and the larger CFA already enrolled, the courses are provided as electives for some other areas.

6.
