Interior Design Accelerated Sequence:

Program Admission Requirements for New and Continuing Students: High achieving students with a cumulative GPA of 3.20 or higher may request the accelerated sequence in the spring semester of their junior year. This sequence allows students to take up to 12 hours of approved graduate courses that will count for both the undergraduate and graduate program in Interior Design/Family and Consumer Sciences. Students can then apply to the Family and Consumer Sciences graduate program in the spring of their senior year. Enrollment in the Accelerated Sequence does not guarantee final admission into the Family and Consumer Sciences graduate program.

- 62 hours required.
- 9 hours in FCS core: FCS 100, 200, 300, 398.
- 53 hours required: FCS 104, 218, 225, 242, 246, 338, 340, 345*, 346, 347, 348, 352, 370, 375 or 475, 376 or 476; TEC 117, 217; one of the following: ART 155, 156, 265, or 275.
- Possible minors based on individual interests: Technology, Art, or Business.
- Recommended electives in consultation with their advisor: FCS 334, 377, 400; TEC 317, 322.

*To graduate in the sequence, a student must take at least one course for graduate credit during the senior year. The student should consult with an advisor and the instructor prior to the start of each course to ensure approval and correct registration for graduate credit.

3. Provide a description for the proposed program.

The Interior Design Accelerated Sequence allows students to take up to 12 hours of approved graduate courses during the senior year that will count for both the undergraduate and graduate program in Interior Design/Family and Consumer Sciences. No changes are being made to the original undergraduate program; 12 hours are simply noted to be taken for graduate credit.

Provide a rationale of proposed program.

Accelerated master's degree programs offer high achieving students the opportunity to complete their bachelor's degree and master's degree with one additional year of study. Students will take both graduate and undergraduate classes during their senior year and seamlessly transition into their master's degree program for one additional year. These programs allow for an efficient move through two degrees and the ability to jump-start student professional development by completing two degrees in less time than it would to complete them separately. It also allows our program to retain high achieving students through both degrees. A separate sequence must be created in order to track students and note which graduate courses can substitute for undergraduate courses. No changes are being made to the original undergraduate sequence.

The Interior Design Accelerated Sequence allows students in the Interior Design Sequence an opportunity to take up to 12 hours of approved graduate courses that will count for both their undergraduate (Interior Design) and graduate (Family and Consumer Sciences) programs.
