Brief Description of the Proposed Program

The Applied Community and Economic Development (ACED) sequence is an interdisciplinary program that enables those who are passionate about social change through service to take their careers to the next level. The sequence is designed for returned Peace Corps Volunteers and students with other development experiences (e.g., AmeriCorps, nonprofit work). The Stevenson Center for Community and Economic Development coordinates these programs for Fellows, who spend an intense year on campus followed by an 11-month paid professional practice. ACED sequence students have a graduate assistantship in the fall and spring semesters on campus (9-months) prior to field work. Students pursuing this sequence receive a solid and relevant educational opportunity to pursue careers in community and economic development in the United States and around the world. The Master of Public Health (MPH) program is designed to prepare students in core competencies needed by professionals working on population-based health issues. Public health professionals work to improve the quality and length of life in diverse communities by preventing health problems before they

occur. They do this through supporting healthy environments, promoting the adoption of healthy lifestyles, preventing injuries, and preserving and protecting important resources that support human health. Public health is an interdisciplinary field built upon knowledge in environmental health, health promotion, epidemiology, medicine and other areas of study. There is a growing need to prepare students for the public health workforce. The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) projects 11% growth in public health careers between 2020-2030. This is particularly true for public health educators (17% projected growth), epidemiologists (30%), environmental scientists (8%), and statisticians (33%). The Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health (ASPPH) projects the deficit of public health professionals in the State of Illinois to exceed 20,000 in the next few years.

Additional ACED sequence students represent a small number of overall MPH students and will progress in the plan of study alongside the Public Health sequence students. All core MPH classes are online. Any additional marketing costs will be minimal and absorbed by the department as part of the overall budget for marketing the MPH. Accreditation will be covered by one program accreditation fee for all undergraduate and graduate sequences. Adding the ACED sequence will not increase the fee.

Community partnerships must be maintained on an ongoing basis. Funding always varies based on host interest regarding off campus internships and placements. We will not admit students until we have a full commitment from community partners for supporting students and have never failed to secure paid opportunities in the second year. The Stevenson Center maintains strong partnerships with a variety of community organizations. They also have full-time staff dedicated to placing students with appropriate hosts and supporting them throughout their internships.
