### BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED PROGRAM

The DNP program is based on national expectations and competencies for graduates of DNP programs as stated by the American Association of Colleges of Nursing. There are two entry points to the DNP program-- students admitted with a Bachelor of Science in nursing (BSN) degree or with a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree.

The Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP): Post-Master's Sequence is designed so that a student with an MSN degree will be able to complete the DNP degree in seven semesters of study. All applicants will be evaluated individually based on prior educational work as well as current experience. Their programs of study will be designed to include additional coursework, if necessary, to position them to achieve the educational objectives of the curriculum.

The Post-Master's DNP sequence is a fully-online program and consists of a minimum of 34 semester hours, including the following requirements:

- 18 hours of core courses: NUR 451, 509, 511, 562, 564, 565
- 3 hours of applied data management: NUR 535
- 6 hours of in-depth clinical residency experience: NUR 550, 552, 554
- 7 hours of scholarly project courses: NUR 539, 543, 545, 547
- A minimum of 1,000 clinical hours post-baccalaureate degree

Advanced standing credit will only be granted for courses completed within five years of admission to the doctoral professional practice program. If beyond five years, up to 15 hours of electives may need to be taken to meet the program requirements. Possible electives include courses in the areas of statistics, advanced finance, human resources, technology, education, and business. Students' programs of study will be designed to achieve the educational objectives of the curriculum. All applicants will be evaluated individually based on prior education work as well as current experience. Academic advisors will work with each student to develop an individualized plan of study.
