Motion XXXV-7: By Senator Meister, seconded by Senator Fowles, to approve the Senate Agenda of September 10, 2003. Provost Presley reported on a proposed requirement for all new students to own computers. He emphasized that this is in no way an attempt to change the way in which courses are taught but is an issue of technological standardization and ease in computing for students. He noted that if students were required to own computers, students can claim this as a cost of attending this University and would be able to get financial assistance for the costs involved, whether by scholarship or loan. The type of computer required would be specified by the program in which the student is enrolled. Tech Zone can provide computer specifications for each program. The Executive Committee agreed that this was not a policy within the Senate's purview for approval and therefore added this discussion to the Senate Agenda as an Advisory Item only.

Given the limited business that the Senate would need to address at the September 10, 2003 Senate meeting, the Executive Committee cancelled that meeting. The Executive Committee agreed to an e-mail vote for the faculty member nominated to the Executive Committee, Senator Eileen Fowles, by the Faculty Caucus on August 27, 2003. Though the Senate meeting was cancelled, the internal committees will be asked to meet on that date.

The motion to approve the agenda was withdrawn.
